

University of Medicine and Pharmacy – Craiova



The University of Medicine and Pharmacy of Craiova (UMFCV), situated in Craiova, Romania, is a distinguished public institution dedicated to medical and pharmaceutical education. Established in 1970 as part of the University of Craiova, it gained independence in 1998. UMFCV comprises four faculties: Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy, and Nursing, offering undergraduate, master's, and doctoral programs. The university provides courses in both Romanian and English, catering to a diverse student body of over 4,400 individuals.

Renowned for its commitment to academic excellence and research, UMFCV boasts state-of-the-art facilities, including modern laboratories, a comprehensive library, and a cutting-edge research center equipped with advanced technologies like PET-CT scanners and cyclotron facilities. The university maintains collaborations with various educational and research institutions across Europe, enhancing its international profile.

Admission to UMFCV is competitive, with an acceptance rate of approximately 10%. Tuition fees for international students range from €6,000 to €8,500 per year, depending on the program. The university offers support services for international students, including accommodation facilities and student associations, ensuring a conducive learning environment.

The University of Medicine and Pharmacy of Craiova is a well-established higher education institution located in the city of Craiova, in southwestern Romania. Romania boasts a rich and longstanding tradition in the field of medicine, with its healthcare system tracing back to the 18th century. A notable example of the country's medical legacy is the 1828 plague in Bucharest, during which 21 out of 26 doctors tragically lost their lives while courageously

treating infected patients. George Emil Palade, recipient of the 1974 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine, was born in Iași, in northeastern Romania. Similarly, Nicolae Paulescu, the renowned Romanian scientist credited with the discovery of insulin, was born in Bucharest.

The Faculty of Medicine in Craiova was officially established on February 10, 1970, as part of the University of Craiova. Over time, the institution expanded its academic offerings with the launch of the Dentistry program in 1990, followed by the Pharmacy specialization in 1996. In 1998, the University of Medicine and Pharmacy of Craiova was officially formed as a separate institution, following its detachment from the University of Craiova.

In 2024, the University of Medicine and Pharmacy of Craiova (UMF Craiova) achieved significant milestones across its academic, research, and community engagement programs. The university organized the 26th edition of the Craiova International Medical Students Congress (CIMSC) from October 31 to November 3, 2024, attracting over 600 participants, including students and internationally renowned doctors from countries such as Italy, Portugal, and Slovenia. The congress featured conferences and over 60 workshops aimed at enhancing the professional training of future doctors.

The university also launched the project "Smile and health through education," in collaboration with the "Carol Davila" University of Medicine and Pharmacy of Bucharest. This initiative aimed to provide dental services to homeless individuals, combining education with direct care.

Additionally, UMF Craiova celebrated its academic community during the UMF Craiova Days from June 5 to 7, 2024. The event featured workshops, open-door sessions for high school students, and retrospective and prospective debates, highlighting the university's commitment to community and communication. The Director of ICD congratulated the university and its international partners on this ground breaking achievement, highlighting the successful integration of AI into medical education in Armenia for the first time.

Eligibility Criteria for Studying MBBS in the University of Medicine and Pharmacy Craiova

- Criteria
NEET score is mandatory to study MBBS in Grigore T. Popa University of Medicine and Pharmacy.
- Academic
Required a minimum of 60% marks in your 10+2 level exam with PCB and in English
- Age Required
Your age should be 17 years on or before 31st December in the time of MBBS admission.
