Duration of MBBS at Collegium Medicum Jagiellonian University

The MBBS program at Collegium Medicum Jagiellonian University, Poland, lasts for a total of 6 years for all students regardless of nationality. The first 5 years focus on theoretical and academic medical studies, while the final year is dedicated to practical training through an internship at an affiliated hospital.

Intake for MBBS at Collegium Medicum Jagiellonian University

The admission cycle for MBBS in Poland opens in July and continues through August, with classes commencing in September. Prospective students are advised to start the application process early with a trusted consultant, as it typically takes around two months to complete. It is also essential to have all required documents ready before receiving the admission offer letter.

Eligibility for MBBS at Collegium Medicum Jagiellonian University

- To be eligible for MBBS admission, candidates must meet the following criteria:
- Age must be between 17 and 25 years at the time of admission.
- ➤ Must have completed high school (or equivalent) with Physics, Chemistry, Biology, and English as subjects.
- ➤ Must have secured a minimum of 50% aggregate marks in these subjects at the 10+2 level.
- For SC/ST/OBC candidates, the minimum aggregate required is 45%.
- > Indian students must clear the NEET examination, which is mandatory.

Admission Procedure at Collegium Medicum Jagiellonian University

- The admission process involves four main steps: Registration, Admission Confirmation, Visa Application, and Travel Arrangement.Registration Applicants must submit scanned copies of the following documents to start the registration:
 - Attested mark sheet and pass certificate of 10th grade
 - Attested mark sheet and pass certificate of 12th grade
 - Birth certificate
 - 12 passport-sized photographs

- Attested and notarized copy of passport
- NEET scorecard
