Admission Process

- To gain admission to the Medical University of Warsaw, students should follow these steps:
- Submit the application through the university's online portal.
- Upload required documents such as passport, academic transcripts, NEET scorecard, etc.

- Receive the offer letter after application evaluation.
- Complete tuition fee payment and prepare visa documentation.
- Enroll in October and begin classes.

Eligibility Criteria for Medical University of Warsaw

- Applicants must meet the following requirements to be eligible for admission:
- Completion of 10+2 with Physics, Chemistry, and Biology, scoring at least 60%
- NEET qualification (mandatory for Indian students)
- Possession of a valid passport
- English language proficiency (IELTS or TOEFL is recommended)
- Documents Required for Medical University of Warsaw
- Scanned copy of passport
- Mark sheets and certificates for 10th and 12th grades
- NEET scorecard
- Birth certificate
- Medical fitness certificate
- Passport-sized photographs
