Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for MBBS admission, candidates must meet the following criteria:

- Age must be between 17 and 25 years at the time of admission.
- Must have completed high school (or equivalent) with Physics, Chemistry, Biology, and English as subjects.
- Must have secured a minimum of 50% aggregate marks in these subjects at the 10+2 level.
- For SC/ST/OBC candidates, the minimum aggregate required is 45%.
- Indian students must clear the NEET examination, which is mandatory.

Required Documents

Applicants must submit the following documents to Wroclaw Medical University:

- Completed application form for the diploma.
- Academic transcript or record of studies.
- Statement of eligibility.
- Criminal record certificate.
- Proof of English language proficiency.
- Hepatitis B vaccination certificate.
- Valid passport.
- Two passport-sized photographs.
- Official Polish translation of documents.
- Recognition certificate from the Department of Education.
