Eligibility Criteria for studying MBBS in the University of Medicine and Pharmacy, Carol Davila

- ➤ Eligibility Criteria: Applicants must have completed their 12th grade with Biology, Physics, and Chemistry as mandatory subjects, securing a minimum of 60% marks.
- Entrance Examination: The university conducts an online entrance test primarily focused on Biology. Upon passing the test, candidates must also successfully complete an interview conducted in English to secure admission.
- English Language Proficiency: Students can present any internationally accepted English proficiency certificate like IELTS or TOEFL, or a Medium of Instruction (MOI) certificate from their previous institution, confirming at least B2 level English proficiency. Alternatively, the university offers an affordable English proficiency exam for admission purposes.
- ➤ Required Documents: Applicants need to submit essential documents such as a valid passport, national ID, 4–5 passport-sized photographs, a statement of purpose, a medical fitness certificate, and their high school academic records
- Application Timeline: The application process, including form submission, document verification, entrance exams, and interviews, typically takes place between April and September.

Admission Process in the University of Medicine and Pharmacy, Carol <u>Davila</u>

1. Online Application:

Begin by filling out the online pre-enrollment form on the UMFCD website. Ensure all necessary documents are uploaded and the processing fee is paid.

2. Entrance Examination:

The university administers an online entrance test, usually covering biology, chemistry, and physics.

3. Proof of Language Proficiency:

You must show evidence of English language skills, either through an internationally accepted certificate (like IELTS or TOEFL) or by passing the university's English exam.

4. Interview Process:

If you pass the entrance exam, you will be required to participate in an interview conducted in English.

5. Document Submission:

Prepare and submit all required documents, including academic transcripts, a financial support statement, medical certificate, and any other documents specified by the university.

6. Housing Arrangements:

Upon admission, you should secure accommodation—either within the university campus or at an off-campus location.
